Detalles del viaje: 10 días

● Día 1 · UK - Night on board

· Arrive at the departure airport ready to board your flight to Cape Town. Night on board.

● Día 2 · Cape Town

· Arrive in Cape Town and pick up your hire car to transfer to the hotel and check-in. The rest of the day is free at your leisure. Relax at the hotel or discover captivating Cape Town and its diverse and vibrant neighbourhoods. Overnight in Cape Town.

● Día 3 · Cape Town

· Breakfast at the hotel. The day is free to explore this beautiful part of the world at your own speed. We can recommend a full day visit of the Cape Peninsula. Discover Seal Island and Chapman's Peak Drive and the highlight of the day, Cape Point's Lighthouse where you can witness the meeting of two oceans and the Cape of Good Hope. Overnight in Cape Town.

● Día 4 · Cape Town

· Breakfast at the hotel. Another day at your leisure. We suggest a full day tour of the Cape Wine route. The route is defined by the towns of Stellenbosch, Franschhoek and Paarl. Along the route the wine estates welcome you to taste wines and cheeses and to learn how the wines are made. Overnight in Cape Town.

● Día 5 · Cape Town - Kruger

· After breakfast drive to the airport for a flight to Kruger Mpumalanga Airport. Pick up your hire car which will give you the freedom to discover the park at your own pace. We recommend you spend as much time as you can in the park from sunrise to sunset as vehicles are not allowed inside at night. Request a packed breakfast and lunch from the hotel and enjoy the rest camps in the park. Overnight stay.

● Día 6 · Kruger

· Breakfast at the hotel. Full day 4x4 Game drive in Kruger Park. Your scheduled departure will leave at dawn as you set out on board an open 4x4 safari vehicle for a short drive to one of the park's gates and into Kruger National Park. It is one of the largest game reserves in Africa, stretching across a vast 18 989 square kilometres in the provinces of Limpopo and Mpumalanga. With over 12 000 elephants, 27 000 African buffalo and 1 000 leopards, the Big Five is well represented. White rhino sightings are frequent, while spotting a black rhino may require some patience and a bit of luck. Lions are plentiful with over 2 000 stalking the plains. Overall, the Kruger supports 147 free roaming mammal species. Of the 517 species of birds here, 253 are resident and the reserve supports six diverse eco-systems. Your morning safari concludes at one of the rest camps inside the reserve giving you the opportunity to stretch, refresh and have lunch (at own expense). After refuelling, set off for the second round of action-packed wildlife discoveries. The 4x4 vehicle will allow you to get very close to the surrounding vegetation while your experienced ranger follows fresh animal spoor. Your safari concludes in the late afternoon. Overnight stay.

● Día 7 · Kruger - Mpumalanga

· Breakfast at the hotel. We recommend a visit to the fabulous site of the Blyde River Canyon. With a depth of 6 to 800 metres, it stretches over 26 km, forming the third largest canyon in the world. Several viewpoints are worth the stop, in particular, the extreme northern one: Three Rondavels. We also like Bourke's Luck Potholes and its impressive rock formations. If you have more time, the small village of Pilgrim's Rest is worth the detour. It was the first place where gold was discovered in South Africa and mined until 1972. Make your way to Mount Sheba for dinner and an overnight stay.

● Día 8 · Mpumalanga - Johannesburg

· Breakfast at the hotel. Familiarise yourself with Pretoria with our suggested visits. The Jacaranda City, as Pretoria is fondly called, is the administrative and diplomatic centre of South Africa that once served as the headquarters for the old independent Transvaal Boer Republic. We recommend visits of some of the iconic landmarks that represent the old independent Transvaal as well as the new democratic South Africa. The Voortrekker Monument is a massive memorial ringed by ox wagons that commemorate the exodus of disillusioned Afrikaaners from the Cape; Church Square houses Die Raadsaal, the former parliament buildings of the Boer Republic; and the Paul Kruger House was the home of the Transvaal Republic's president. The Union Buildings should not be missed, built in 1910 and now housing the official seat of the South African government as well as a nine-metre statue of former president Nelson Mandela. Travel the short distance to Johannesburg for an overnight stay.

● Día 9 · Johannesburg - Night on board

· Breakfast at the hotel. Drive to airport for overnight flight back to the UK.

● **Día 10** · UK

Arrive back in the UK. End of trip.
