### Detalles del viaje: 8 días

#### **Ida**

##### ● **Día 1 · UK - Dusseldorf**

Arrive at your UK departure airport for a flight to Dusseldorf. Transfer to the port. The cruise begins in this German city famous for its Carnival. The elegant and bustling town on the Rhine stands out for fashion, shopping and cultural offerings. The Königsallee, one of the most luxurious avenues in Europe, is within walking distance of Altstadt, the old town with its 260 bars and restaurants, whose world-famous style. Its narrow streets are full of life and the cultural offer brimming with spectacular events and exhibitions. Welcome cocktail and overnight on board.

##### ● **Día 2 · Koblenz**

Full board on board. At lunch time, arrive at one of the most beautiful and ancient cities of Germany: Koblenz. The city is located in the world-famous "German corner". The spectacular landscape formed by four central massifs, vineyards and forests surround this town, whose existence of more than two thousand years is reflected in the architectural heritage in the form of wonderful churches and palaces, ancient aristocratic houses and the magnificent stately houses of the gentry. Night on board.

##### ● **Día 3 · Mannheim**

Full board on board. Mannheim is synonymous with mobility: in 1817 Karl Drais built the first bicyclist in the university city between the Rhine and the Neckar and in 1886 the first car of Carl Benz began to circulate in its streets. Monuments such as the second largest baroque palace in Europe and the Water Tower, in the middle of one of the most beautiful Jugendstil style sets on the continent, await you to discover them. In addition, institutions such as the State School of Music and Performing Arts, the Pop Academy of Baden-Württemberg, the Superior School of Technique and Design and the Free Academy of the Arts contribute to making Mannheim's environment one of the most creative in the world. We recommend an optional visit to Heidelberg.\* Night on board.

##### ● **Día 4 · Stasbourg**

Full board on board. In the morning arrive in Strasbourg, the capital of the Alsace region. The historic centre, Grande Île, was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1988 to form a clear example of a medieval city. The place where the canals can be found is named after Petite France, an old fishermen and miller's neighbourhood. Amongst the attractions of the Petite France are the covered bridges (Ponts-Couverts), a defensive structure with medieval watchtowers and the water regulation system (Barrage Vauban). In addition to the Petite France, the historic centre houses a large number of interesting monuments, including the cathedral, an imposing building that combines different styles of construction and stands as a symbol of the city. The Palais Rohan, majestic palace, houses 3 museums in its interior. We recommend an optional guided tour to show you the most emblematic sights of the city.\* Night on board.

##### ● **Día 5 · Speyer- Mainz**

Full board on board. Early in the morning, we will arrive at Speyer, a city that has the largest Romanesque cathedral in the world, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1981, in which numerous emperors of the Holy Roman Empire are buried. In addition to the Imperial Cathedral, Speyer has an important Jewish legacy. The main gate of the city is one of the highest in Germany. At dinner time, reach Mainz, a city with a historical heritage of almost 2000 years. The cityscape is dominated by the Cathedral. In the shadow of the temple, the medieval Mainz where life goes on angular and narrow streets in the many small shops, boutiques and cafes that surround the wonderful Kirschgarten with its romantic half-timbered houses stretching. As opposed to the bustling historic quarter, the panorama of Mainz on the Rhine side seems more relaxed and calm. Night on board.

##### ● **Día 6 · Boppard - Bonn**

Full board on board. After lunch, we will arrive at Boppard, an ancient Roman city located in the part where the river has the most abrupt turn of its entire course and forms a horseshoe. The city offers many sights worth seeing: Oberstrasse main street lined with typical houses with wooden beams on the facade, the Marktplatz, the Basilica of St. Severus, the Roman wall, Balduin castle and the church of the Carmelites. After dinner, reach Bonn, a symbol of postwar growth, diplomacy and democracy. Night on board.

##### ● **Día 7 · Bonn - Cologne**

Full board on board. Bonn is a city with a history of more than two thousand years and is known worldwide for being the capital of Germany until the fall of the Berlin Wall. It is the birthplace of Beethoven and there is a museum here in his honour. The historic centre and its pedestrian are ideal for strolling, shopping and sampling typical regional foods or visiting one of its 30 museums. After lunch, reach Cologne, the oldest German city that hosts countless cultural and historical treasures, world-famous museums and a varied art scene. Take a trip through 2000 years of history and visit cultural monuments from the time of the Roman Empire to modern times. Our optional guided tour takes you to the old town of Cologne and its famous Gothic cathedral, a symbol of the city for centuries.\* In the evening, the Captain's Dinner will make for a glamorous end to your cruise. Night on board. \*Excursions package: £190
